CYCLES A to C OVERVIEW

CYCLE A Big Idea To introduce students to God and his word

Students will become familiar with God who made us, who loves us and saves us from the consequences of turning against him. They will learn how God is always faithful to his people, and what it means for people to have faith in God.

A1 – Concentrates on Old Testament (but includes Easter)

Term 1 – God our creator who loves us and saves us

Term 2 – Trusting God who is faithful—people who learned to trust God

A2 – Concentrates on New Testament

Term 3 – Jesus teaches about having faith in God

Term 4 – Trusting and following Jesus

CYCLE B Big Idea To explore how God makes and keeps his promises

CURRENTLY UNDER REVIEW

Students will learn about people who received promises from God, and will come to understand that God's promises can be trusted. They will learn how Jesus fulfils God's promises and why people continue to trust Jesus today.

B1 – Combination of Old Testament and New Testament

Term 1 – Who is Jesus? (Luke's Gospel)

Term 2 – God's big promises—Abraham to Joseph

B2 – Combination of Old Testament and New Testament

Term 3 – God keeps his promises—Moses to the Promised Land

Term 4 – God's promises for the whole world—Romans

CYCLE C Big Idea God's kingdom is eternal and because of Jesus we can be part of God's family

CURRENTLY UNDER REVIEW

Students will learn about God the King and how he calls people to live under his leadership. They will understand that although people reject God's kingship and experience the consequences of their rejection, God's kingdom plan continues. Students will consider how Jesus reveals God's kingdom and how, by trusting Jesus as King, people can be part of God's kingdom forever.

C1 – Term 1 – God's great kingdom plan: Samuel to David

Term 2 – Remember God is King: Solomon to Nehemiah

C2 – Term 3 – Jesus is the King of God's kingdom: John's Gospel

Term 4 – Living in God's kingdom

Bible Timelines are included at the beginning of each unit to encourage an understanding of where each lesson fits within the flow of the Bible story. Easter is always at end of Term 1, meaning that some themes do backtrack through the Bible. A specific Christmas lesson is also included in each Cycle.

2	Theme: God’s good creation Lesson aim: To help students to understand that God is the loving Creator of the world and created the world for a purpose.	Genesis 1:1–25

4	Theme: Celebrating God’s good creation Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God’s greatness is shown in creation, and how his people respond to him in thanks.	INF and LP – Psalm 8 UP – Psalm 145
5	Theme: Ignoring our Creator Lesson aim: To help students to understand from the Bible that the world is not as God intended because people have not loved and trusted him.	Genesis 3
6	Theme: Life away from the garden Lesson aim: To help students to understand how people’s rejection of God has affected human relationships, and to see how God continues to love his people.	Genesis 4
7	Theme: God’s promise to save (Noah) Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God loves those who trust him, and plans to save them, through the example of Noah.	Genesis 6–9
8	Theme: Jesus seeks the lost (Zacchaeus) Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God sent Jesus to help people to turn back to God and live as his friends, through the example of Zacchaeus.	Luke 19:1–10
9	Theme: Jesus saves the lost Lesson aim: To help students to understand that Jesus willingly gave his life so that people could be friends with God forever.	Luke 22–23
10	Theme: Living proof Lesson aim: To help students to understand that Jesus rose from the dead and is alive today, and that people continue to trust him.	Luke 24

TERM 2	Trusting God who is faithful	
11	Theme: Bible overview—Old Testament (People who learned to trust God) Lesson aim: To help students to understand that God has a plan for his world and his people.	Various
12	Theme: Gideon Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God is patient, and helps people to trust and obey him, through the example of Gideon.	Judges 6–7
13	Theme: Naomi and Ruth Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God loves and protects people and wants them to trust him in difficult times, through the example of Naomi and Ruth.	Ruth 1–2
14	Theme: Ruth and Boaz Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God cares for his people, and how he uses the actions of people to do this, through the example of Ruth and Boaz.	Ruth 3–4
15	Theme: Elisha Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God shows his power and care for people when his people obey him, through the example of Elisha.	2 Kings 2–13
16	Theme: Jonah Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God shows mercy and calls ordinary people to trust and obey him, through the example of Jonah.	Jonah
17	Theme: Isaiah Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God calls people to speak about him and wants people to turn back to him, through the example of Isaiah.	Isaiah (various)
18	Theme: Josiah Lesson aim: To help students to understand that God wants his people to trust and obey him, through the example of Josiah.	2 Kings 22–23
19	Theme: Esther Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God uses people in his purposes, and how trusting God can mean being courageous, through the example of Esther.	Esther
20	Theme: Lesson on Contemporary Christian Lesson aim: To help students appreciate that God gives people skills and talents, which they can use to serve him.	Various
SPECIAL	Theme: Self-Esteem Lesson aim: To help students to understand that God created them, and that he values and loves them.	Various
ASSEMBLY	Theme: Easter—God’s rescue plan Assembly aim: To help students to understand that God wants all people to hear the good news and to put their trust in Jesus.	Luke 23–24

1	Theme: Bible Overview—New Testament (Trusting Jesus as Lord) Lesson aim: To help students to understand how Jesus fits into God’s plan to save his people.	Acts 7
2	Theme: Hearing God’s word (the soils) Lesson aim: To help students to understand Jesus’ teaching that God wants people to listen carefully to his word, trust Jesus, and follow his teaching.	INF, LP: Luke 8:4–15 UP: Matthew 13:1–23
3	Theme: Real treasure Lesson aim: To help students to understand Jesus’ teaching that loving and trusting him is more important than anything else.	Matthew 13:44–46
4	Theme: The rich fool Lesson aim: To help students understand Jesus’ teaching that everything we have comes from God and we can trust him to give us everything we need.	Luke 12:16–31
5	Theme: Loving God, loving others (The good Samaritan) Lesson aim: To help students to understand Jesus’ teaching that all who trust Jesus are to show God’s love to others.	Luke 10:25–37
6	Theme: The great party Lesson aim: To help students to understand Jesus’ teaching that God invites everyone to have faith in Jesus and to become part of his family.	Luke 14:15–24
7	Theme: Lost and found Lesson aim: To help students to understand Jesus’ teaching that God forgives and welcomes those who turn to him, and that everyone needs God’s forgiveness.	Luke 15:11–32
8	Theme: The rich young man Lesson aim: To help students to understand Jesus’ teaching that through Jesus, God does the ‘impossible’ when he forgives people and welcomes them into his family.	Luke 18:18–30
9	Theme: Real greatness Lesson aim: To help students to understand Jesus’ teaching that greatness in God’s kingdom comes from serving others, rather than from having other people serve us.	Mark 10:35–37,40–45
10	Theme: Matthew: a follower of Jesus Lesson aim: To help students to understand how Jesus called Matthew to follow him, how all people need Jesus’ forgiveness, and how Jesus continues to invite people to trust him and become part of God’s family.	Matthew 9:9–13

11	Theme: Peter learns about real faith Lesson aim: To help students to understand what it means to trust and follow Jesus through the example of Peter.	Matthew 14:22–34; 16:13–17, 26; John 21; Acts 2–5
12	Theme: Philip Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God helps Christians to tell others about Jesus, and how people sometimes respond in faith, through the example of Philip.	Acts 6:1–7; 8:26–40
13	Theme: Saul—Changed by Jesus Lesson aim: To help students to understand that people can change as a result of knowing and trusting Jesus, through the example of Paul.	Acts 9:1–31; 13:1–3, 46–47
14	Theme: Paul and Barnabas Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God uses people to encourage others and tell people about Jesus, through the example of Paul and Barnabas.	Acts 14:8–20
15	Theme: Lydia Lesson aim: To help students to understand how people hear about and accept the gospel, and how this is lived out in people’s lives, through the example of Lydia.	Acts 16:11–15
16	Theme: Priscilla and Aquila Lesson aim: To help students to understand how God equips Christians to serve him and how his plan is for Christians to work together in his service, through the example of Priscilla and Aquila.	Acts 18; Romans 16:3–4
17	Theme: Timothy (Lois and Eunice) (Lesson 18 in Upper Primary) Lesson aim: To help students to understand that God’s Holy Spirit gives his people strength to serve Jesus and to serve others, through the example of Timothy.	Acts 16; 1 and 2 Timothy
18	Theme: Philemon and Onesimus (Lesson 17 in Upper Primary) Lesson aim: To help students to understand that God wants his people to forgive others as he has forgiven them, through the example of Philemon and Onesimus.	Philemon
